Teaching Gospel Essentials in Latvia

In August I traveled to Latvia to teach and preach the gospel. Latvia, a small country of about two million people in the Baltic region of northern Europe, gained its independence from the former Soviet Union in 1991. Experiencing a difficult history, Latvia has been three times since its founding conference in Jaunjelgava, in 1918, once by Nazi Germany and twice by the Soviets. Although the predominate religion in Latvia is Lutheran, that denomination has become very liberal in its theology. As a result, the church practices and teaches the traditions of the church



rather than the gospel. The Lord opened the door for me forcibly invaded and occupied to teach and preach at a Bible Latvia, that was attended by many pastors and church lay leaders. Basing my teaching and preaching on the core tenants or essentials of the gospel, I used a quote from a famous Lutheran theologian, Rupertos Meldenius, to set a theme for the Bible conference. In the 1600's.

Meldenius said, "In essentials unity, in non-essentials liberty, in all things charity." I reminded the conference attendees of the essentials of the gospel and encouraged them to revive the teaching and preaching of these essentials in their churches. One night I preached an evangelistic message and gave an invitation for people to receive Jesus Christ as Savior and over half of the conference participants responded publicly and accepted Christ. Please pray for these Latvian church leaders as they return home to lead their local congregations. May the Lord use them as modern day reformers in their churches to reignite a passion for the proclamation of the true gospel of Jesus Christ.
