Nigerian Crusade

When I started planning an evangelistic crusade in Nigeria almost a year ago, no one in the United States could remember the last time they heard the word Nigeria mentioned on the nightly news. As our Nigerian crusade date drew near, Nigeria became a nightly topic in the news. Boko Haram terrorists and Ebola were both ravaging Nigeria and had become household topics of discussion in the United States. Many concerned friends and supporters were encouraging me to reconsider my scheduled mission trip and crusade. I have to admit I was tempted



to take their advice. However, as I prayed, the Lord gave me peace that I should keep moving forward with the crusade. On September 24th, I landed in Lagos, Nigeria, at the very airport where the first Ebola patient had become ill and brought Ebola into the country. Everywhere I looked there were signs talking about Ebola. Local authorities checked my temperature four times before I left the airport.

On my seven hour drive to the crusade location, every few miles we passed through military check points that had been set up to stop Boko Haram terrorists from infiltrating further south from their strongholds in the north. However, I could feel the sustaining prayers of those praying for me and the crusade. Over the next few days, the Lord blessed the four day crusade in a mighty way. I was able to proclaim the truth of the gospel to multiplied thousands of people that had never heard the Good News. During the four night crusade, 1,710 people came forward publicly to accept Jesus Christ as their Savior. Please join us in praising the Lord for the great things He did in Nigeria!

297 Complete Training

During the Nigerian crusade I conducted a three day Bible conference for local pastors and church leaders. On the final day we distributed 297 certificates to people who completed the training. Because many of the pastors in Nigeria have had little or no theological training, many churches have poor or errant teaching and preaching. The prosperity gospel movement has infiltrated the Nigerian Christian church in its worst form. An unbiblical understanding and teaching on money, material wealth, and faith healing have replaced the true gospel in many churches. During the Bible conference I was able to

emphasize the essential doctrines of the gospel. Many of the pastors and church leaders soaked up the teaching and were eager to learn



the truth. However, we did have some pastors that rejected my teaching and were offended that I was challenging the prosperity gospel that they teach and preach. A few of the pastors began discouraging their members from

attending the crusade. However, my translator who was also a local pastor, told me the people were still coming to the crusade. I asked him why the people were coming even though their pastors discouraged them. He said the people saw that I was teaching and preaching the truth straight from the Bible. He also said the people were seeing more real miracles take place at the crusade than they had ever seen at their churches’ healing services even though I did not emphasize healing. I thank God for allowing me to train these church leaders. Please pray with me that they will disseminate the teaching in their churches.
