## Sharing Jesus in Uganda

This fall, Carla and I spent seven weeks sharing the gospel in Uganda. The Lord opened the door for us to preach in schools, prisons, refugee camps, hospitals, churches, live on radio stations, and in a seminary. We also conducted five outdoor crusades in different areas of Uganda, the last two of which were in the remote West Nile region of northern Uganda. The final crusade was held in Koboko, the former hometown of the infamous Ugandan leader, Idi Amin. Koboko is about two miles from the Democratic Republic of Congo border and ten miles from the



South Sudan border. Both of these countries are experiencing military conflict. For many years northern Uganda was a war zone and is still trying to recover physically and spiritually from those years of strife. The Lord blessed our 19 nights of crusades with good weather and large crowds. We preached the gospel face-to-face to over 50,000 people, all of whom heard the good news of the gospel. During these evangelistic outreach services 2,812 adults and youth publicly received Jesus

Christ as their Savior. These new converts completed commitment cards so local churches could follow up with them after the crusades. We partnered with local churches and pastors from across denominational lines during each crusade and ministered closely with local crusade organizing committees. We thank the Lord for allowing us to uplift the name which is above every name, the name of Jesus Christ. Please join us in praying for the spiritual growth of all those that received Christ as their Savior. Also pray that the Lord will bring forth spiritual fruit from the many seeds that were sown in the lives of thousands of lost people. Thank you for partnering with us to take the gospel to the uttermost.

## Refugee Camp Outreach

Tens of thousands of Congolese and Sudanese citizens have flooded into northern Uganda over the last years as war raged in their countries. Uganda has opened several refugee camps to house these war refugees. Uttermost Evangelism



received permission from the Prime Minister of Uganda to visit and preach the gospel in

several of these refugee camps. Our team took portable sound equipment and set up in multiple locations to minister to the refugees. We proclaimed the hope and peace that can be found only in Jesus Christ. Many refugees prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Savior.

Alpha-Omega is an accredited seminary in Jinga, Uganda, training students from across East Africa. I am honored to serve as Vice President of Alpha-Omega's board of directors.
