## **Bringing Living Water to Guyana**

In January, with a mission team of 15 men, I was able to travel to Guyana, South America, a small country with less than a million people. Our ministry was focused in the rugged, remote interior area of the country where we ministered to the native Amerindians that make up about 10% of the country's population. They live in relatively small settlements scattered throughout the vast wetlands of interior Guyana. We traveled by small boats on rivers that crisscross the jungle-like terrain that stretches toward Venezuela and Brazil. Most of the team drilled freshwater wells for small villages and schools, providing an immediate source of clean drinking water that improves quality of life and health among the Amerindian families. While the team was drilling freshwater wells,

I was able to help train about 50 Amerindian pastors and church leaders. I also traveled in the evenings to preach evangelistic services in multiple small Amerindian churches. It was an amazing experience to bring life-giving physical water and the eternal Living Water of Jesus Christ to people at the same time. Over 200 adults and youth were saved during the evangelistic services as well as many children. Many rural pastors were trained to more effectively reach



their own people with the gospel while thousands of people also were provided access to clean drinking water. Your partnership with Uttermost Evangelism is making life-changing ministries like this possible.



## **Krewe of Jesus Christ**

This year we spent many days and nights at numerous Mardi Gras parades. All of the parade groups that roll during Mardi Gras are called krewes. Many of the krewes are well known and have a long history of parading in New Orleans. Although we are not members of one of the traditional krewes of Mardi Gras, we were there to represent the "Krewe of Jesus Christ." The parade routes are always filled with thousands of people partying, dancing, eating, drinking, and even openly doing drugs. A festive atmosphere of anything goes permeates the carnival goers and parade routes. It is in this spiritually dark place that we attempted to shine the light of Jesus Christ. During our Mardi Gras outreach this year, we distributed over 10,000 gospel tracts and shared our faith oneon-one with many people. The response of the people we encountered was across the spectrum: some thanked us and encouraged us, some were indifferent, and some cursed us

and our God. However, the success of this outreach is not measured by the response of the people. The outreach was a success because Jesus was lifted up and the good seed of the gospel was sown. Please pray that the Lord will cause those seeds to take root and produce a great spiritual harvest.
