## Mission Team Accomplishes Much in Guyana

In January I traveled to Guyana, South America, with a 15 member mission team led by my good friend, Ben Yantis. Ben is 80 years old and has been doing mission work in Guyana for many years. The mission team

members, some of whom I helped recruit, were from North Carolina, Florida, Texas, Indiana, and Illinois. Part of the team installed fresh water wells in villages without clean drinking water. Robert Blume, one of the Uttermost Evangelism board members, led another part of the team in constructing a church in an Amerindian village. They completed the entire building and even built pews for the new church building. On the last work day, I led a dedication service for the new building and eight people accepted Christ. During the days we were there, a pastor on our team and I led a Bible conference for about 40 pastors and church leaders. Our team was able to provide David Jeremiah study Bibles for the conference attendees. I was able to conduct a five night



crusade in the city of Bartica, Guyana, during which over 100 adults and youth accepted Jesus as Savior and Lord. The Lord truly blessed the ministry of this team and used them to minister to both physical and spiritual needs.



## First Crusades in Tanzania, East Africa

During the last six years, we have conducted 30 crusades in the east African countries of Rwanda, South Sudan, and Uganda. This month the Lord allowed us to conduct our first crusades in Tanzania, another country in east Africa. Tanzania has a large land mass and a population of around 55 million people, of which nearly 40% are Muslim. It took a lot of planning and logistical work not only to prepare for crusades in Tanzania, but also to take our equipment across the border and into the country. The first crusade was conducted in Rubafu, a remote fishing village on the shores of Lake Victoria, one of the top five largest fresh water lakes in the world. Our crusade venue went right up to the shore of the lake. The Lord blessed, and 814 people accepted Christ during that first crusade. As I write this newsletter, I am concluding our second crusade in the town of Bukoba which has a population of around 70,000 people and is also located on the shores of Lake Victoria. Tight security in Tanzania

prevented us from conducting the crusade services after dark. However, despite having to start the services very early and conclude them before sunset, the Lord blessed us with good attendance. During the four crusade nights, 750 adults and youth accepted Christ as Savior and Lord. Thank you for partnering with us to expand our evangelistic outreach in Africa.
