# **Evangelistic Outreach in Germany**

Germany is a modern, prosperous western European country. Materially speaking, most of the citizens lack nothing. The spiritual condition of the German population is much different. While 25% of Germans identify as

evangelical Christians, only 3% of them are attending religious services regularly. Like much of western Europe, the vast majority of Germans have abandoned Christ and the Christian church. The rise of atheism, agnosticism, and apathy for spiritual things has left many convinced Germany cannot be reached for Christ. In November, I had the opportunity to proclaim the Gospel in this beautiful but spiritually cold land. During each of those services, we saw men and women come forward publicly to accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. God blessed our outreaches despite severe COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, such as requiring masks to be worn in the church at all times and observing social distancing. In addition, there was a



government mandate that all attendees register their names and addresses at each service. We witnessed first hand in Germany that the Gospel has not lost its power and is still the power of God for salvation for all who will believe. Praise God for breaking the chains of bondage and drawing people to Himself for salvation.



## **Evangelistic Revivals in Moldova**

In November, Carla and I traveled to the Republic of Moldova and preached evangelistic meetings in four village churches. The villages where we preached, Pascani, Andrusul de Sus, Badicul Moldovenesc, and Rumeantev, are decades behind neighboring Romania in development. Moldova is a country that has been left behind by the modern world, not being embraced by Europe like Romania, Hungary, and other countries to the west. However, they are also no longer a communist country and do not have strong ties with Russia. Moldova has become a sort of no man's land, a land barrier between Europe and Russia. The citizens speak Russian, Romanian, or Moldovan depending on what part of the country they live in. The economy is weak, much of the infrastructure has collapsed, and most of the citizens are poor. The villages of Moldova feel like the uttermost. It was a joy for us to lift up Christ, preach the everlasting Gospel, and bring hope to this depressed land. We stayed in the home of a local village pastor with his family because hotels were too far away to commute. The host family and all the village churches welcomed us with open arms and generous hospitality. The Lord

drew people to Himself during all of the services, and people came forward publicly at all four churches to accept Christ. Thank you for helping us take the Gospel where others do not want to go.
