



Saturating Tanzania with the Gospel

We started our 2024 ministry schedule with three back to back crusades in Tanzania, Africa, by conducting four day crusades in Muganza, Misungwi, and Usagara. To this date, we have now conducted over 35 outdoor evangelistic crusades in Tanzania as we continue to saturate one region of the country after another with the Gospel. During the three most recent crusades, 2,973 people publicly invited Jesus Christ to be their Lord and Savior. One of the highlights of these crusades was the great partnership and cooperation we had with local churches. Dozens of local indigenous churches and pastors partnered with us. During follow-up meetings with the pastors, we heard many testimonies about how the crusades had brought the local churches and pastors together in unity and cooperation like never before. The pastors also expressed amazement at how many lost people had come to Christ in their communities and how many of them had already visited their churches even before they began organized follow-up. These testimonies from local pastors encourage us that the crusades are not only producing spiritual fruit but are producing spiritual fruit that will remain. We are excited to continue to partner with local churches and pastors around the world to help them reach their local communities for Christ.





Sowing Gospel Seeds at Mardi Gras

I got home from three and a half weeks of ministry in Tanzania on a Tuesday night, and the next morning Carla and I pulled out heading to Louisiana. We drove 840 miles and went straight to a Mardi Gras parade in Houma, Louisiana. During the last days of Mardi Gras Carla and I distributed thousands of Gospel tracts at different locations and parades. All of the parade routes are several miles long and run down main roads that are closed to traffic. Thousands of people line both sides of the parade routes, and at the larger parades there can be tens of thousands of people of all ages and from every walk of life. In fact, if you want to get a vivid look at the current condition of our country and society, all you have to do is walk down one of the Mardi Gras parade routes. There you hear vulgar music blaring from many speakers at top volume, you witness open alcohol and drug use and abuse, and you see many people dressed in very inappropriate clothing. Even at the parades, which are promoted as family friendly, it is shocking sometimes how people can publicly conduct themselves in such

an indecent way. However, it is always an honor to lift up Christ and spread the Gospel in these spiritually dark and difficult public arenas.
