



Crusades in a New Region of Tanzania

In late May and early June, Uttermost conducted three more evangelistic crusades in Tanzania. Over the last few years we have conducted about 40 evangelistic crusades there. Someone recently asked me, “Why do you keep going to Tanzania since you have already done so many crusades there?” The simple answer is that Tanzania is a big country. With a land mass about 30% larger than the state of Texas, it is divided into 31 regions, and we have conducted crusades in only five of those regions. Two of the three most recent crusades took place in Tabora, a region where we had never held crusades before. This means there are still 26 regions of Tanzania where we have not conducted a single crusade. The country also has a large population with over 63 million people making it the most populous country whose entire landmass lies south of the equator. The UN reports that Tanzania will be one of eight countries in the world responsible for more than half of the world population growth over the next three decades. It is critical that this exploding population be reached for Christ rather than being lost to Islam. During our most recent crusades 2,004 people accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior. Thank you for helping us further our goal of saturating this vital African country with the Gospel.





Mission Team Partners with Uttermost

In June, eight team members, most of whom were from Highland Park Baptist Church in Mt. Airy, North Carolina, joined Carla and me in Uganda. The team helped us conduct two crusades in the West Nile region of Northern Uganda. During the two crusades in Paidha and Panyimur, 2,357 people publicly accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior. Both of these towns are within a couple of miles of the Democratic Republic of the Congo border and are very remote and impoverished. At each crusade location, some of the mission team members also helped conduct a three day conference for pastors and church leaders on the “Essentials of the Gospel.” Over 300 local pastors and church leaders completed the training and received certificates. The conference focused on 11 essential doctrines that make the Gospel possible. Every day prior to the crusade services, the mission team also helped lead an evangelistic VBS for children 12 years old and younger. The smallest number of children in attendance on a single day was about 400, and the biggest single day had over 800. We thank God for the team members’ willingness to use their time, talents, and spiritual gifts to lift up Christ and proclaim the everlasting

Gospel in the uttermost areas of Uganda. Your partnership, prayers, and faithful sacrificial support are also a vital part of making outreaches like this possible.
