



## Moldovan Youth Camps

In July, for the third and final year in a row, our ministry sponsored two weeks of youth sports camps in Moldova. The first week we sponsored 220 youth between 14 and 18 years of age, and the second week we sponsored 180 youth. The camps were organized around a volleyball championship because volleyball is one of the most popular sports in that country. Around 40 coed teams of ten members each from towns and villages around the country participated, over 70% of whom were unchurched, non-Christian young people. The youth, who arrived on Monday morning and stayed until Saturday morning, attended a chapel service every morning and evening. All of the messages I preached during the camps centered around introducing Jesus Christ to these precious young people. I preached on the birth of Jesus, the dedication of Jesus, the baptism of Jesus, the temptation of Jesus, the miracles of Jesus, the ministry of Jesus, the message of Jesus, the death of Jesus, the resurrection of Jesus, and the ascension of Jesus. A large number of the non-Christian youth publicly accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior during the two weeks of camp.





## Georgia Evangelistic Outreach

For the second year in a row the Lord opened the door for us to evangelize in Georgia, a transcontinental country that separates Eastern Europe and Western Asia. During our first visit to that country, we discovered that over ten thousand medical students from India were studying there. We also met a Christian female doctor from India who was serving as a missionary to those medical students. Since our visit last year, the missionary has married, and she and her husband, who is also a doctor, are now serving together as missionaries to the Indian medical students, most of whom are Hindu, Muslim, or atheist. While we were in Georgia this year, we held an outreach which was attended by several hundred Indian medical students. We praise the Lord that sixteen of those students made a public

decision to accept Jesus Christ as their Savior and that all of the students had the good seed of the Gospel sown in their hearts.



## Family Conference in Germany

Recently I was invited to conduct a family conference at two different churches in Germany. I taught on “how to build an ark for the saving of your family” based on the life of Noah. In one church two people were saved, including a Muslim man, and in the other church three people were saved. Many church members were challenged to be more intentional in evangelizing and to start with their own family members.
