



First Outreach in Honduras

In May, the Lord opened the door for me to do my first crusade in Honduras. I had been to Honduras many years ago but not since starting Uttermost Evangelism. I have prayed for some years that God would open some doors for our ministry in Central America. My dear friend and ministry partner, Marcus Navarro in Bolivia, helped us finally get in through some of his pastor contacts. Honduras is a small country plagued by a great deal of crime. Recently I saw a list of the most dangerous countries in the world today, and Honduras was in the top twenty. The crusade was held in the city of Comayagua, which has a population of about 180,000 people. We rented a large sports facility for the crusade venue. We didn't have large crowds but we had good attendance, and many people were saved during our first evangelistic efforts in Honduras. I also had an opportunity to speak in local schools and share the Gospel. Many students indicated a decision to accept Christ as their Savior. We hope this is the first of many open doors in Honduras and Central America.

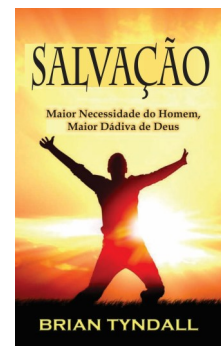
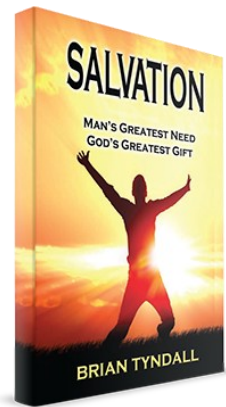




Crusades Continue in Tanzania

Since the countrywide unrest and political crack down following Tanzania's presidential election last fall, our ministry has been made both more difficult and more dangerous. Public protests have decreased, but the government still closely monitors large public gatherings. The United States recently announced a comprehensive review of its diplomatic, economic, and security ties with Tanzania because of the government's treatment of its citizens since the election. Our most recent crusades in June were conducted near the border with Kenya, an area more predominately Muslim than Tanzania as a whole. We were so close to the border that we even had Kenyans who crossed the border to attend these crusades. The first crusade was in Nyamongo where 710 people came forward publicly to receive Jesus Christ as Savior. The second crusade was in the town of Sirari where 808 people filled out decision cards indicating their decision to accept Christ as

Savior and Lord of their life. I am thankful that God continues to give us open doors and His protection to take the Gospel to even the troubled places in the world.
